FALL RIDING

- Remember, as visibility decreases at dusk and after sunset, other motorists have difficulty seeing riders.
- Helmets with visors or tinted shields help reduce glare, but riders may still have problems seeing oncoming traffic.
- The ideal position for riders to be most visible is in their own lane of travel.
- Riders should always assume that a vehicle is going to pull out in front of them and adjust their speed and position accordingly.
- Wet leaves reduce traction and pose a risk for riders. Cognizant riders should adjust their speed on curves and look well ahead to choose the best path to go around a hazard.
